From the Rector's Desk

January 6....

Such a big day! Right?

Yeah.

The visit of the Three Kings to Our Lord. The Epiphany. God showing the gentiles, the nations, that Jesus is the Messiah. (You thought I was talking about a certain conflagration in DC a little while back, didn't you!)

It's interesting that January 6, the Epiphany, is a much older celebration of God becoming human in Jesus than Christmas Day is. In fact, in a lot of countries, including some Latin countries where some of our newest members come from, it's still a bigger feast of the Incarnation than Christmas.

I remember spending some time with friends in Puerto Rico, visiting the villages they were from and seeing the sights. We were in an important regional city on January 6. The whole city shut down, with parades, music, vendors, and a religious/liturgical drama in the town square. The characters in the drama included the prophets that foretold of the Messiah, His Mother, etc. And the Three Kings rode on horseback into the town square in full regalia. The crowds cheered, choirs sang, bands played, priests and bishops blessed and sprinkled the people in their most festive clothing. Glory to God in the highest!

I got inspired and wrote a poem about the Three Kings, Epiphany, and Puerto Rico. I got it published somewhere years ago, but I don't remember where. I've included it for you to read here, if you feel like it. In the poem, I've incorporated things like the ocean around Puerto Rico, the Kings, Spanish colonial history, indigenous history, thoughts about who we are and belong to as Christians. This, of course, is only to ponder more deeply who Jesus is and to worship Him.



Did you know?

How to get an event /activity scheduled on the church calendar. (This is an updated reminder.)

This procedure is for all vestry, ministry leaders, or anyone who wants to use the church facilities for any activity. Our parish administrator, Crystal Lopez, coordinates use of the facilities at Grace, through our master calendar. (Calendar on reception desk IS NOT THE MASTER CALENDAR.) When requesting space for meetings or events there is a process that everyone is asked to follow:

- 1. The event request must be made at least one week in advance so that if there is a scheduling conflict it may be resolved in a timely manner. Please be aware there are ongoing meetings that are already in place on the calendar. You are welcome to call the Parish Administrator to check availability for your upcoming event, before requesting event form.
- 2. Event request/building usage forms are located on the parish office desk for completion. Forms should be completed by the requesting individual, and then returned to the parish office inbox.

Requests will be submitted to the Rector for his approval, and then Crystal will put it on the master calendar and notify you.

Thank you for adhering to these steps. If you have questions or need further clarification, Crystal can assist you.


November Vestry highlights:




